Ralph Oehme was born in 1954 in Geithain (Saxony). He studied theatre studies and worked as an acting teacher in Leipzig. From 1986 to 1989, he directed the Leipzig Chamber Music Theatre (Kammermusiktheater Leipzig). Since 1987, he has been working as a freelance writer and director. Additionally, he is a visiting lecturer in drama at the University of Music and Theatre "Felix Mendelssohn Bartholdy" in Leipzig and at the Ernst Busch Academy of Dramatic Arts in Berlin. He wrote numerous stage plays, opera libretti, radio dramas and screenplays. In 1990, Ralph Oehme received the prestigious Blind War Veterans' Radio Theatre Prize for "Silent Heroes Rarely Prevail". In 1997, he won the Literature Fellowship of the Free State of Saxony as well as the Leipzig Literary Scholarship.
